She is the daughter of the late Bill Wilson Jr., Kaach.ádi clan leader of Hoonah, and Susan Price of Palmer, embodying a deep connection to both her heritage and family legacy.

Amelia's journey with the Huna Heritage Foundation began when her father inspired her by gifting her 100 Huna Totem shares while she was pursuing her education at the University of Alaska Fairbanks. A scholarship recipient of the Huna Heritage Foundation, Amelia completed her bachelor's degree and set her sights on giving back to her community. In 2016, she joined the foundation as an Archivist, where her vision and dedication led to the creation of the Huna Heritage Digital Archives. This groundbreaking Mukurtu CMS web portal preserves and shares audio and visual content of cultural and historical significance to Hoonah. Her work earned the Huna Heritage Foundation the prestigious 2019 International Guardians of Culture and Lifeways "Archives

Institutional Excellence" Award from the Association of Tribal Archives, Libraries, and Museums.

Amelia's impact extends far beyond her professional role. As the longest-serving city council member and vice mayor of Hoonah, she has consistently championed her community's well-being and development. In addition to serving as President of the Alaska Native Sisterhood Camp 12, she has most recently been designated as the delegate for Hoonah to the Tlingit and Haida Central Council. Her unwavering commitment to service reflects her belief in fostering opportunities for current and future generations.

Amelia's leadership is inspired by her dedication to cultural preservation and education. She continually seeks to deepen her cultural knowledge and is honored to share it with others. However, of all her accomplishments, Amelia's greatest pride comes from raising her three sons-Kyran, Ronin, and Ethan. "Family means the most to me," she shared, emphasizing that her personal and professional paths are guided by her devotion to her children and the values instilled by her family.



DISTRIBUTION/2025 SHAREHOLDERS SETTLEMENT TRUST (SST) PAYMENT SCHEDULE

Established in 1994, the Shareholder Settlement Trust distributes payments based on a 2% multiplier of the rolling five-year market average of the Trust, as outlined in the 10-year review approved by shareholders in 2019. The 2025 distribution amount will be announced before the March 15th payment date, following the completion of the annual audit. Distributions will occur on March 15, August 15, and November 15, 2025.


ALASKA NATIVE VOICES RETURNS TO THE HOMELAND FOR THE 2024 SEASON

Alaska Native Voices proudly returned to the homeland for the 2024 season, offering enriching cultural experiences through its heritage programs.

This season, three Cultural Heritage Guides from Gustavus shared their knowledge and expertise with guests onboard Holland America and American Cruise Lines.

Our guides delivered over 125 main stage lectures and countless hours of insightful commentary, sharing our deep connection to our rich Tlingit history.

We are grateful for our enduring partnerships with the Hoonah Indian Association and the National Park Service. Looking ahead to 2025, Alaska Native Voices is excited to build on this year's achievements and continue celebrating and sharing Alaska Native heritage.





HTC BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

2024 saw the opening of two new destinations in Huna Totem's Alaska Native Tourism Network – Port Klawock on Prince of Wales Island, and the Whittier Cruise Ship Terminal near Anchorage.

Port Klawock hosted six ship calls in its inaugural season and set the stage for strong growth in 2025 and beyond.

Visitors were able to enjoy the scenery and culture of Klawock through its totem park, master carvers, culinary experience, and

marine tours. Looking to 2025, the port will offer additional attractions, and, in keeping with the spirit of lcy Strait Point, will honor the community's culture and values while providing guests with a world-class experience.

After a challenging period of construction, the terminal and dock in Whittier are nearly complete and prepared to operate for the full 2025 cruise season. Despite construction obstacles, the port hosted its first ship in 2024, presenting a valuable opportunity to test the experience and refine operational practices ahead of the 2025 season.

These two new destinations expand and enhance Huna Totem's operational presence in the Alaska cruise market and will strengthen the Alaska Native Tourism Network in the years ahead.

SHAREHOLDERS ENCOURAGED to SUPPORT ÁAK'W LANDING

Huna Totem is working with the City and Borough of Juneau (CBJ) to obtain the necessary permits and tidelands lease for the Áak'w Landing dock and uplands development.



Two informational meetings were scheduled for January. The open-house format provided an opportunity for community members to gather information

and provide feedback. In February and March, the CBJ Assembly will continue to discuss the proposed lease conditions and hear public testimony. The Assembly's meeting schedule, contact information, details for participation via Zoom, or watching recordings are available online at juneau.org/assembly.

Áak'w Landing will be located at the "subport" near the Coast Guard facilities on Egan Drive and Whittier Street. The development will feature an Indigenous knowledge, science, and cultural center, waterfront dining and shopping, as well as a new public park and seawalk.

This project will help alleviate congestion in downtown streets by removing thousands of buses, reduce cruise ship emissions by enabling ships to dock rather than anchor, and create jobs and economic opportunities for the community. Huna Totem plans to begin construction in 2025, with projected completion in 2027.

HunaTek, the federal contracting arm of Huna Totem, had another outstanding year in 2024. Christine Youngquist, US Army Lieutenant Colonel Ret. Clara Driscoll, and US Marine Corps Major Ret. William Polania for Memorial Day and Veterans Day events hosted by the Southeast Alaska Native Veterans Association, reinforcing its commitment to community and veteran support.

Shareholder Internship Opportunity: HunaTek welcomed Shareholder Lauren Walicki for a ten-week summer internship in business development, exemplifying its dedication to cultivating shareholder talent.

Cybersecurity Excellence: Achieving a perfect score on its cybersecurity audit, HunaTek is well-positioned to meet the Department of Defense supply chain security requirements, set to roll out in 2025.
